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Notes to the Summary Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 June 2018

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The summary financial statements have been derived from the audited financial report of Primary and Community Care Services Limited for the year ended 30 June 2018. The audited financial report for the year ended 30 June 2018 is available on request from the registered office.

The financial statements, specific disclosures and the other information included in the summary financial statements are derived from, and are consistent with, the full financial statements of Primary and Community Care Services Limited. The summary financial statements cannot be expected to provide as detailed an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of Primary and Community Care Services Limited as the full financial statements.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied to Primary and Community Care Services Limited and are consistent with those of the previous financial year in their entirety. The presentation currency used in the financial report is Australian dollars.

3 Discussion and Analysis

Statement of Surplus or Deficit and Other Comprehensive Income

The surplus from operating activities for the year was \$267,107 (2017: \$122,649).

Revenue

Revenue for the year was \$6,480,989 (2017: \$2,534,803). Operating grant revenue has increased due to a full year of service delivery of the Psychological Support Services contract, as well as continued business growth and development.

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Notes to the Summary Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 June 2018

Expenditure

Total expenses for the year were \$6,213,882 (2017: \$2,412,154). The majority of costs for 2018 related to employee benefits expense (\$2,627,646) and program delivery expenses (\$2,773,081).

Employee benefits expense increased \$887,385 due mainly to growth in the workforce, reflecting an increase in growth in various programs.

Program delivery expenses increased \$2,441,465 as a result of payments to clinicians for provision of the Psychological Support Service in 2018.

Statement of Financial Position

Total assets increased by \$1,454,448 to \$4,486,718 (2017: 3,032,270). This increase is reflected in cash and cash equivalents and trade and other receivables which increased by \$1,072,821 and \$349,850 respectively. These increases have arisen from grant funding received, and funding receivables for costs incurred in expanding the Company's operations.

Total liabilities increased by \$1,187,341 to \$3,278,902 (2017: \$2,091,561). Increases in liabilities mainly reflected an increase in trade and other payables of \$838,782, other liabilities of \$291,332 representing unexpended grants and employee benefits of \$123,260. Trade and other payables have increased due to accrued clinical services for the Psychological Support Services program. Employee benefits liability increased in line with the increase in staff numbers to deliver the various programs.

Statement of Changes in Funds

The total funds of the Company increased solely due to the operating surplus of \$267,107 (2017: \$122,649).

Statement of Cash Flows

The Company's cash position has increased to \$3,730,038 (2017: \$2,657,217).

Net cash inflows from operating activities totalled \$1,076,573, with increases in cash received from grant funding during the year. Cash payments to suppliers and employees also increased compared with 2017, in line with increased service delivery.

Cash invested in company assets during the year totalled a net outflow of \$3,752 (2017: \$17,713).
