What is **Carers Connect**?

Carers Connect offers free, confidential, one-to-one sessions designed around you.

- ✓ Practical support
- ✓ A listening ear
- ✓ Time for you.

You might want help working through a decision, managing stress, building confidence, finding more time for yourself, or simply talking things through with someone outside your usual circle.

Carers Connect is informed by evidence-based wellbeing approaches, including Low Intensity Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (LiCBT) and Social Prescribing. Your Coach can help you explore practical strategies and connect with other services or community supports when useful.

What can I **expect**?

- ✓ A space to focus on you
- ✓ Time to talk about what matters to you
- ✓ Practical ideas and strategies
- ✓ Support with everyday challenges and decisions
- ✓ Flexible sessions by phone, video or in person
- ✓ Support at a pace that works for you
- ✓ Help connecting with other supports when useful
- ✓ Completely free and confidential.

- Talk through something on your mind
- Manage stress, worry or competing responsibilities
- Build confidence or strengthen everyday routines
